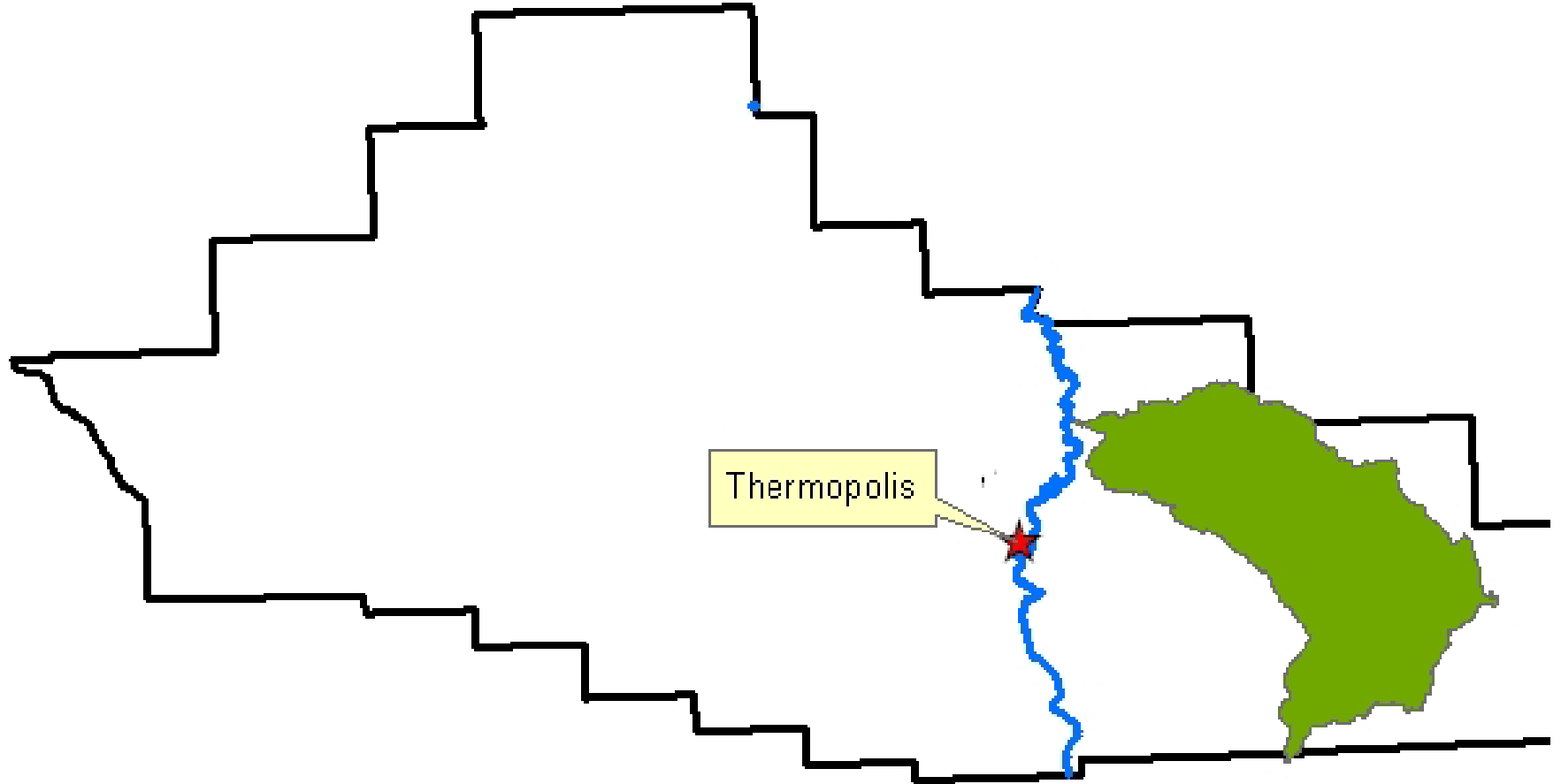

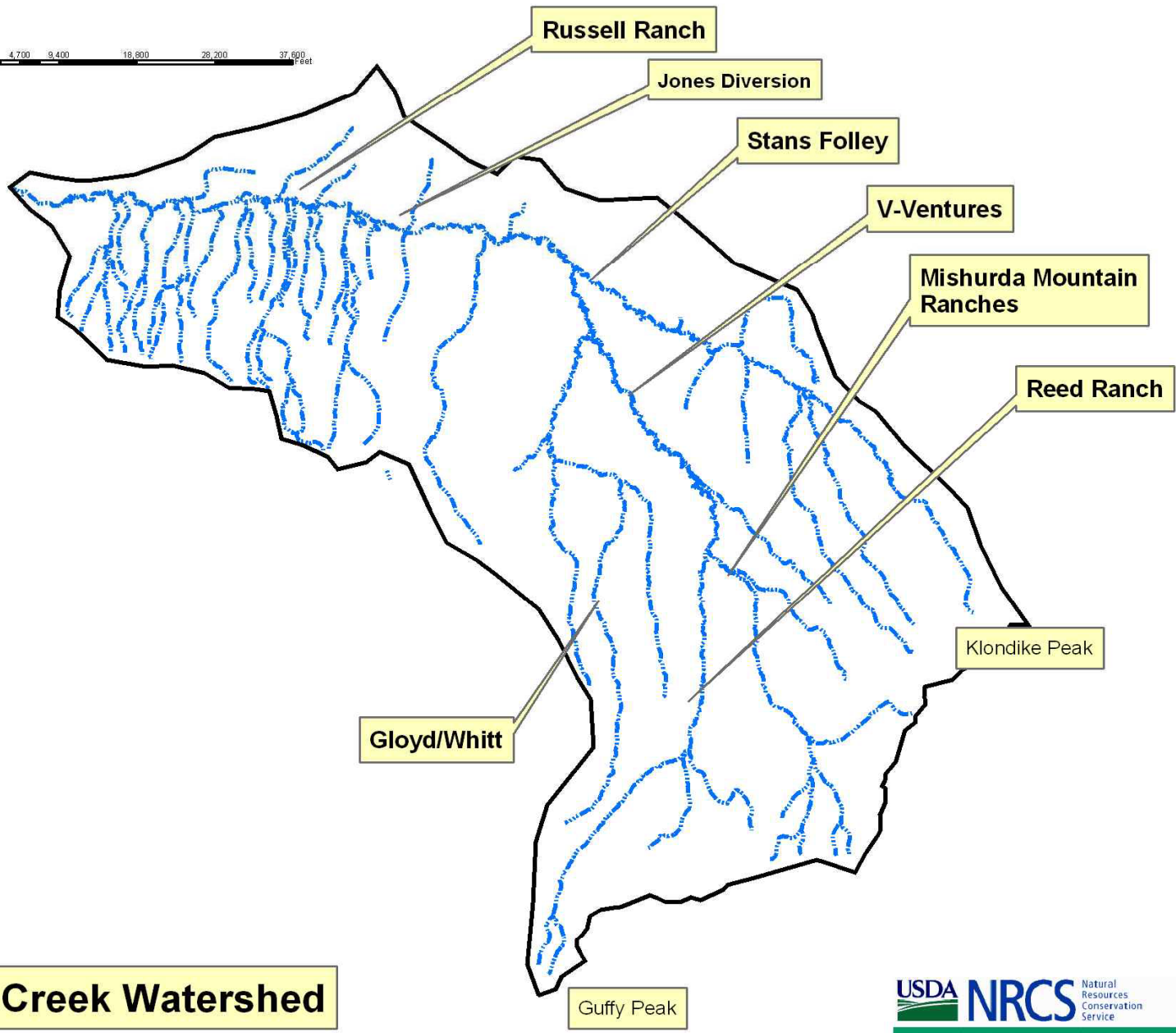

Kirby Creek Watershed

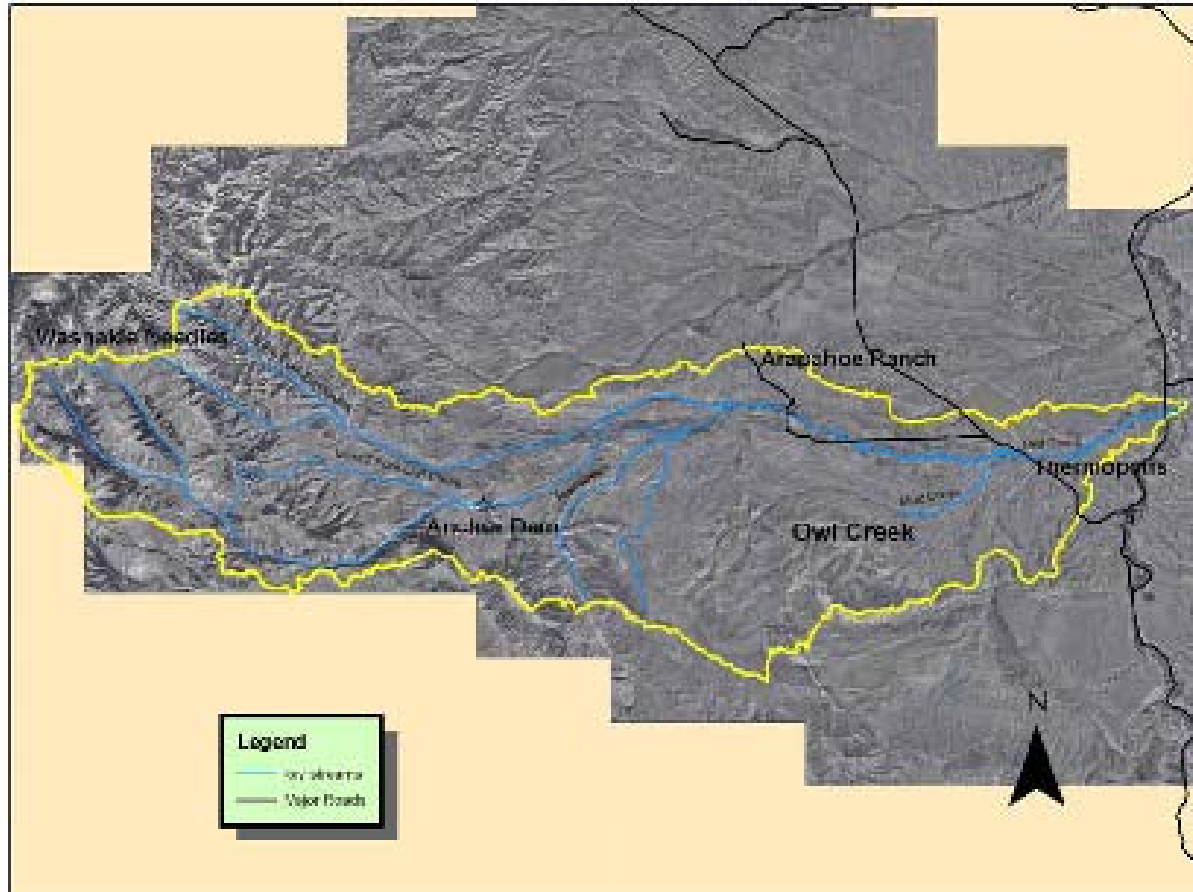

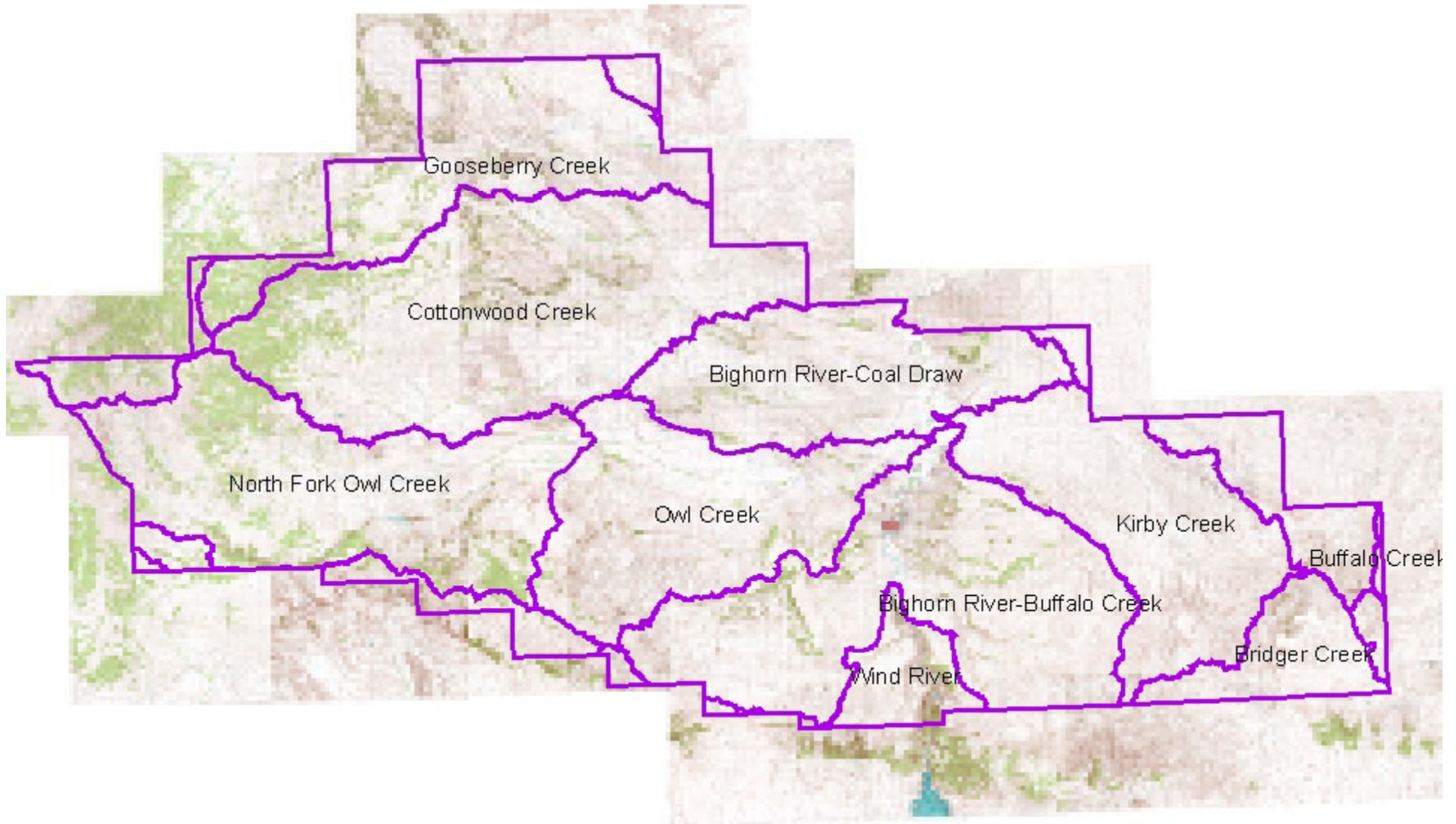

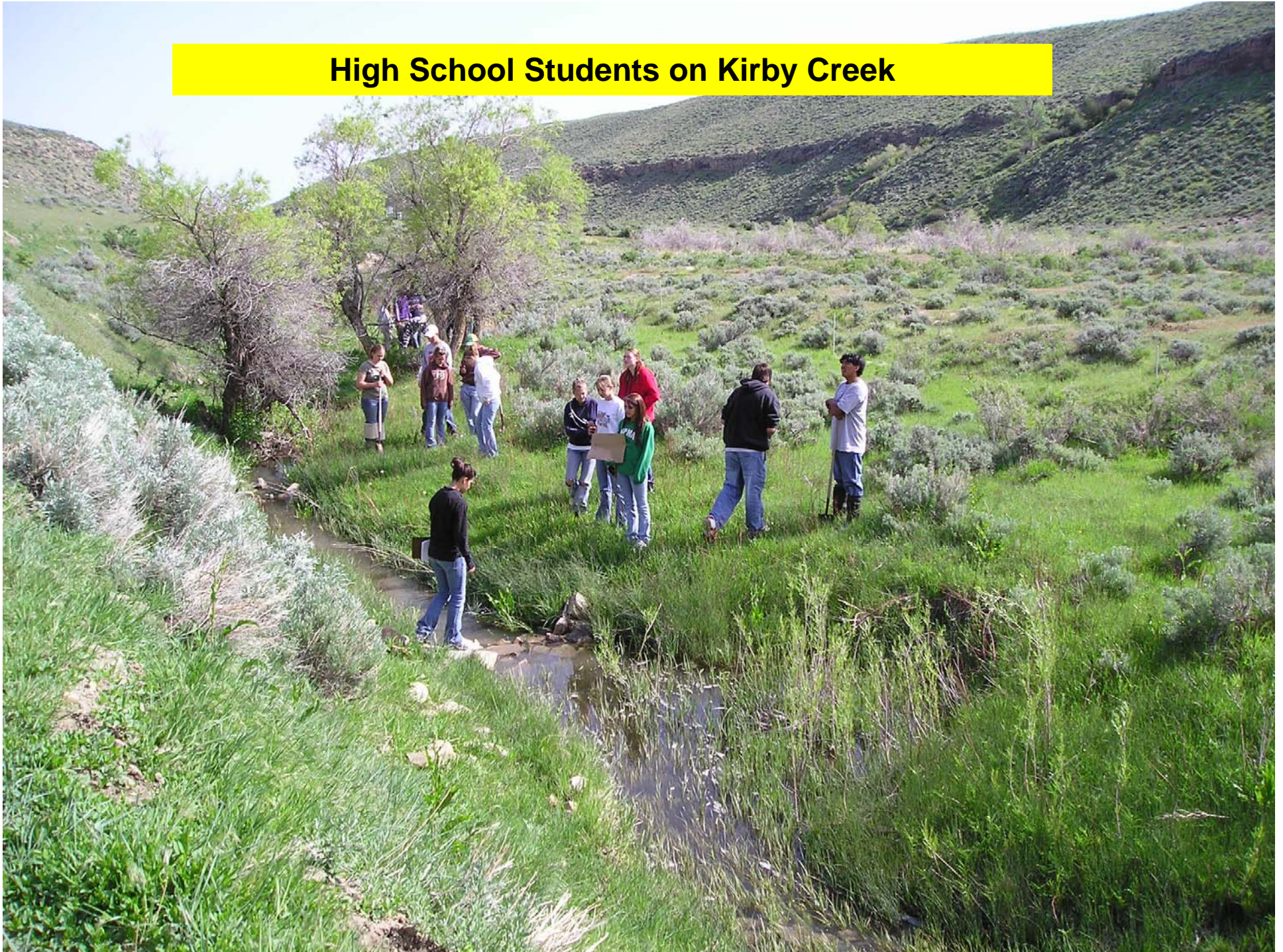

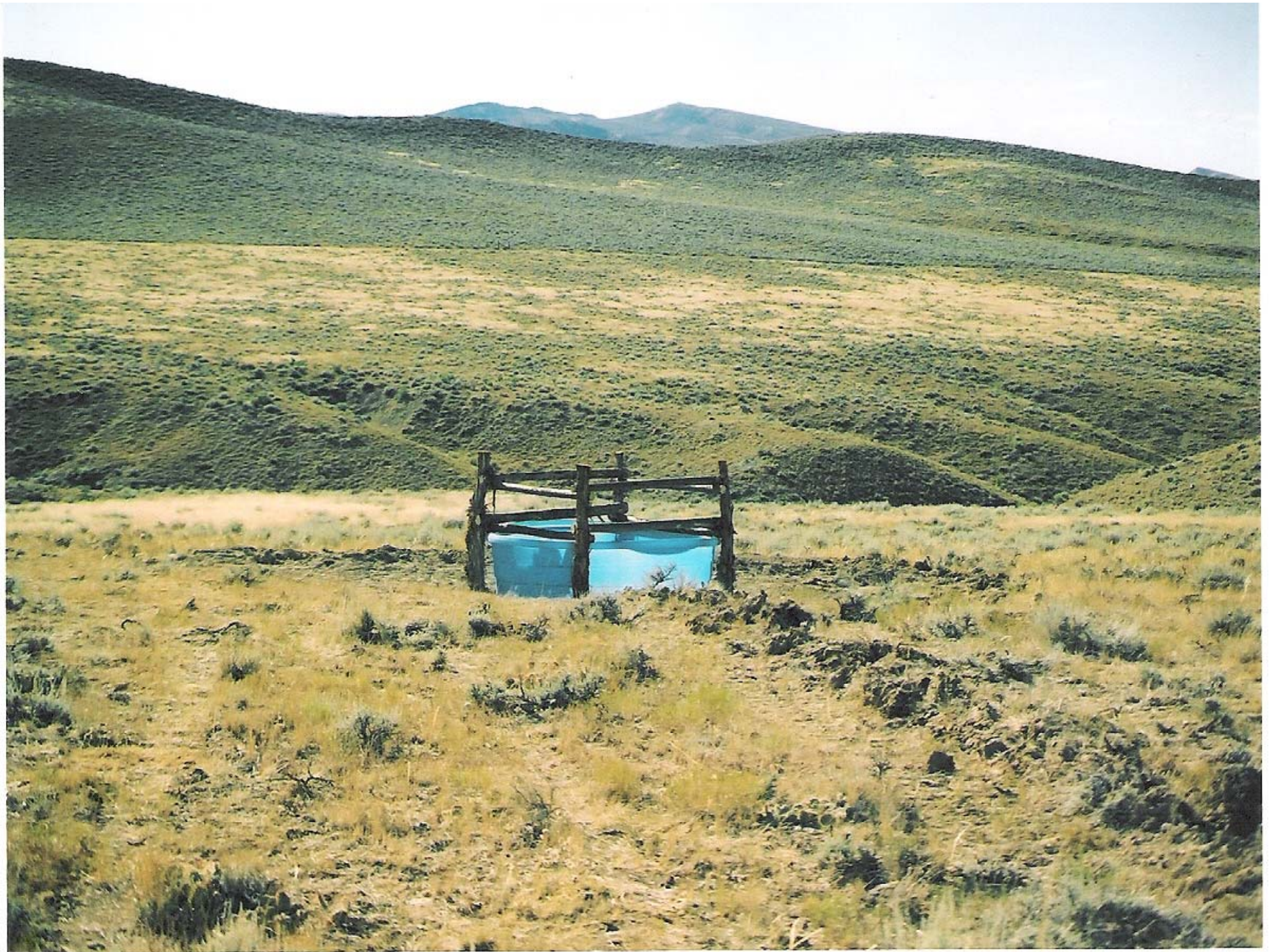

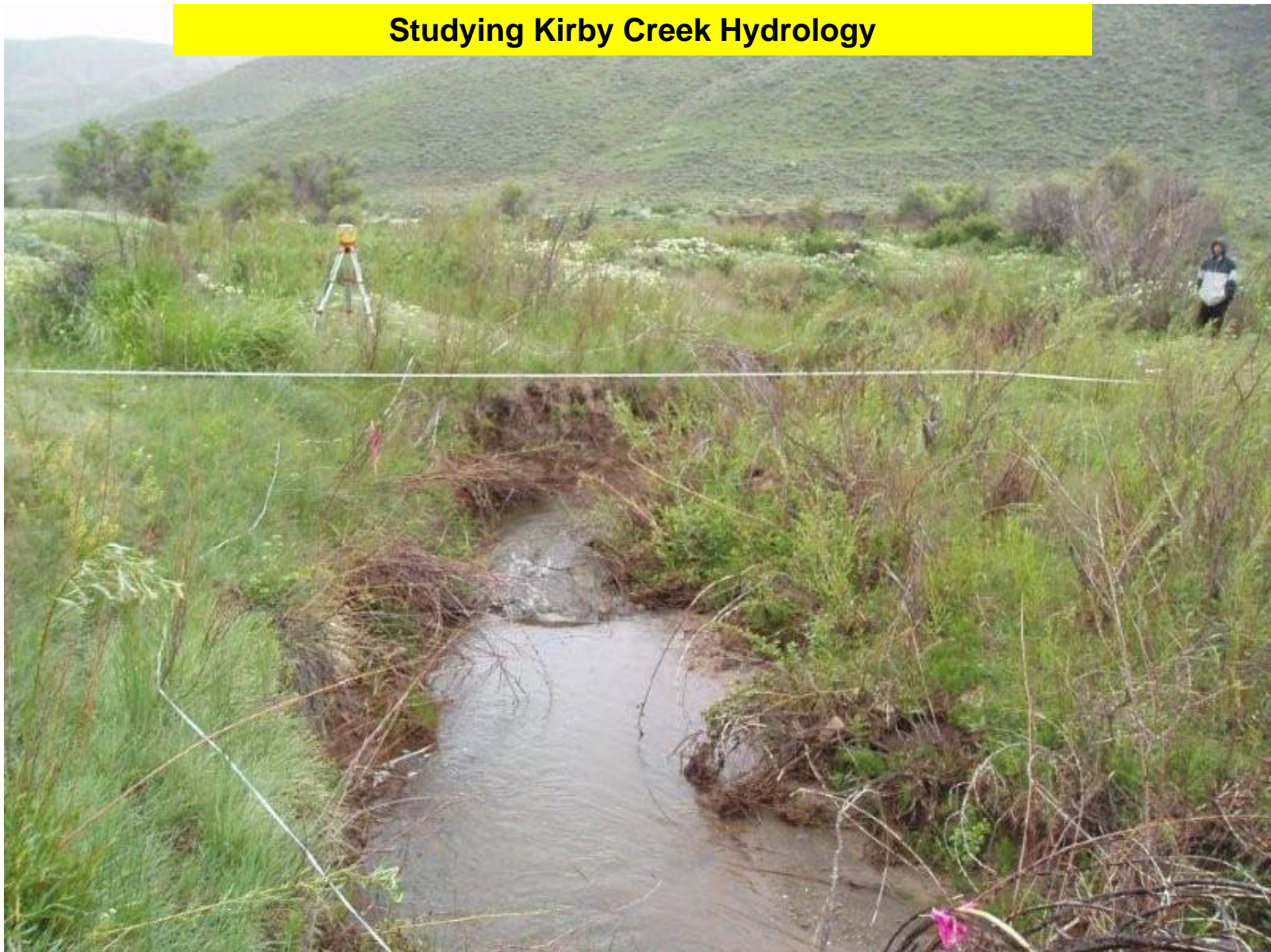
